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Paradise Bakery & Café opened in November of last year as part of the new wing to the Greenwood Park Mall, located just across from J. C. Penney. They have six locations in the Indianapolis area, serving breakfast, lunch, dinner and snacks, including their famous chocolate chip cookie (which took first place at the past Zoobilation event). They make and bake the cookies, bread and muffins fresh each day.

Debbie Miller, Director of Catering and Marketing, provided some suggestions for trying out the menu. For a nutritious start to the day, try the Paradise Oatmeal & Fruit, made with steel-cut oatmeal (100 percent all-natural oatmeal) served on top of an oatmeal cookie and topped with fresh strawberries and bananas. Paradise also offers a full coffee bar. One of their signature dishes is the Fire Roasted Tomato Soup, generally considered the most popular item on the menu. On the fare for sandwiches is the well-liked Chicken Walnut Salad Sandwich with homemade bread, or for those who want to be more adventurous, try the innovative Meatball Panini or the Tuscan Grilled Chicken.
